NEWS FROM THE ASSISTANT ACADEMY HEAD

This newsletter is a celebration of the fantastic finale to yet another challenging year. However, although it is important that we acknowledge the challenges, especially with the uncertainty facing the country at the moment; it is the enthusiasm, positivity and resilience of the children, staff and families that should be celebrated. After a busy half-term of learning across the school, the children have enjoyed a festive week in the lead up to the end of term.

Last Friday we held our own Christmas Jumper Day to raise money for the Friends of Winterton Primary School which was a great way to start our Christmas festivities. On this day, we also learnt that the Christmas Raffle organised by the Friends of Winterton Primary School had raised an amazing £507, with an additional donation coming from the charity bottle from the Fishermans Return. Each child also enjoyed receiving a chocolate selection box present from the Friends - thank you for this kind gesture

Our whole school community also enjoyed a wonderful Christingle Service at the church, where the children had the opportunity to make a Christingle, find out about the origin of the Christingle and what it symbolises and share a range of Christmas songs from traditional carols, to nativity ensembles and even a rendition of O Christmas Tree in German. Due to the current COVID restrictions in school and similar restrictions last year, this was the first time in two years that the children could perform to their families at Christmas so it felt like a very special occasion. Thank you to Father John and Sandra Laws for their support in leading and organising the service, and to Tesco in Caister for their donation of the oranges for the Christingles.

The end of last week also saw the culmination of lots of hard work and rehearsals for our performance of A Wriggly Nativity. The children performed fantastically on stage for two different recordings of the performance, one edited which has been shared on our Facebook page, and an unedited straight run through which has been shared on the Google Classroom and which was also enjoyed live by the Shark Class. We hope you enjoy the children's fabulous performance and the many magical moments of a school nativity. We are already planning our first whole school live performance in over two years, which we hope to bring to you at Easter if restrictions allow and if not in the summer term - watch this space!

On Wednesday the whole school enjoyed an incredible visit to the Hippodrome Circus, where everyone sat in awe and wonder at the amazing talent displayed by the dancers, jugglers, magicians, entertainers and acrobats. The children's behaviour was exemplary and it made us feel very proud to take nearly 70 children from 3-11 years old and to genuinely be able to say that the whole experience was a pleasure. The music, lights and energy of the production really is a spectacle and is something that cannot be replicated. If you haven't been to the Hippodrome Circus in Great Yarmouth before, then it is well worth a visit!

Finally the children ended the week with a whole school Christmas dinner, a Christmas party and a visit from Father Christmas, courtesy of Terry Byrne. A huge thank you to Terry for organising the arrival of Father Christmas on a procession of military vehicles and for the kind gifts the children received.

STARFISH CLASS



This term Starfish Class have explored many books and enjoyed the activities that autumn has had to offer. We began this half term by creating a fireworks display in the hall. We painted splashes of reds and yellows to show how the fireworks burst in the night sky.

In Maths the Starfish learnt how to add and take away numbers from 0 to 10 and show their workings using a part part whole model. In literacy we read about Arnie the Doughnut and learnt how a friendship grew between Arnie and Mr Bing. It was also a treat to try a doughnut for ourselves as a snack. We found out that doughnuts come in all different shapes and sizes just like us. The children discussed how we must celebrate these differences just as we do when we enjoy our favourite types of doughnuts.

The Starfish Class have also shown their love for the story Stickman, by making their own to play in activity time. This story also prepared the children for the Christmas period when Santa flew the Stickman home. As Christmas came closer the children wrote letters to Father Christmas telling him they were 'nice' this year and asking for lots of nice presents. They were then sent a present from Santa (a book called 'The Most Wonderful Gift in the World') where Little Bunny Boo Boo searched for a brand new friend.

Our most enjoyable experience this term was the Nativity play where the children worked very hard to remember all the words to the songs and they looked fantastic in all their costumes. Their singing was phenomenal and they really do deserve a well-earned rest this Christmas.

The Seal Class have had a very busy half-term completing their first Talk For Writing unit in English where they learnt the to retell the story of The Lion and the Mouse, before adapting the story to create their own versions which they could then write confidently using the same structure as the original story which they knew from memory. One of the titles included The Polar Bear and the Arctic Fox. At the start of this story, the polar bear traps the arctic fox and threatens to kill him but then lets him go free with the promise of a favour in return. When the polar bear then gets his foot trapped in a hole in the ice, the arctic fox comes to his rescue and uses his claws to dig him out.

Learning about mountains in geography has really engaged the children and they have enjoyed discovering how mountains were formed, where mountain ranges are located, the key features and the positive and negative effects that tourism can have on areas with mountains. If only we could go and visit some real mountains!

In science, the children have enjoyed exploring the seasons and finding out about how and why the weather changes across the seasons. They have also learnt why the daylight hours are less in the summer and more in the winter affecting the length of the day.

In PE, the children have been creating gymnastic routines using sequences of balances, jumps and travel. They have also been learning how to make contrasting shapes and how to work with a partner, as well as individually.

We have ended the term by completing a range of Christmas activities, including 3D Christmas cards, reindeer hot chocolate sachets, Christmas cake pops and snowmen measuring sticks.

After learning how to use different grades of pencil and experimenting with using charcoal to shade and sketch, the Sharks have been developing their life drawing skills. 






DT club

PE Days

On your child's PE day, as listed below, please ensure they come to school dressed in clothing suitable for PE. Lessons may be indoors or outdoors so please send warm clothing with a t-shirt or shorts underneath in case they get hot. Children must wear suitable footwear such as trainers and have separate shoes for indoors, such as plimsolls, if they do not have wellies to wear outside at playtime. Please ensure that long hair is tied up and all jewellery is removed before coming to school.
